The Presentation of the new Vicar

A representative of the Patron, accompanied by the Churchwardens, presents Rev Darius Weithers to the Bishop, saying:

Bishop Joanne, I present to you *Darius Weithers* to be admitted to the Cure of Souls in the parish of St Paul, Old Ford.

The Affirmation

Bishop Priests are ordained to work with the Bishop as servants and shepherds among the people to whom they are sent. They are called to baptise, to proclaim the Word of the Lord and to preside at the Eucharist.

In order to fulfil this ministry Darius needs your prayers and encouragement. Before I license him I require his assurance that he accepts the responsibilities of his new office in the Church; and your assurance that you will work with him in partnership and give him the encouragement he needs.

Bishop Priest and people, will you work together as servants of Christ in this place?

All **By the grace of God, we will.**

Bishop Darius, will you seek to enable these people to become the people of God; will you lead them in worship and in service; will you encourage them to share in the life of the Gospel and proclaim God's saving love to the world?

Priest *By the grace of God, I will.*

Bishop People of God, will you be faithful members of the Body of Christ? Will you support Darius and, together with him, serve the Kingdom of God?

All **By the grace of God, we will.**

The Declaration and the Oaths

Bishop The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the Catholic Creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies - the Thirty Nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer, and the ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons.

Darius, in the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace

and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

The Declaration of Assent

Priest I, Darius Orellano Weithers do so affirm and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the Catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness, and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

Then the Priest takes the oaths, holding the New Testament in the right hand.

The Priest faces the congregation for

The Oath of Allegiance

Priest I, Darius Orellano Weithers swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, her heirs and successors, according to law.

The Priest faces the Bishop for

The Oath of Canonical Obedience

Priest I, Darius Orellano Weithers swear that I will bear true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of London and the Area Bishop of Stepney and their duly appointed successors, in all things lawful and honest.

The Collect

The Bishop prays:

Bishop God our Father, Lord of all the world,
through your Son you have called us
into the fellowship of your Universal Church.
Hear our prayer for your faithful people
that in their vocation and ministry
each may be an instrument of your love,
and give to your servant Darius
now to be instituted the needful gifts of grace;
through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

The Liturgy of the word

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus

Spiritual Blessings in Christ

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has
blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly

places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, ^{to} the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, ^{as} a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ^{so} that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

Paul's Prayer

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ^{far} above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in

this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Perseverance in Prayer

I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.

The Institution

The Bishop reads the legal document which Darius is holding a copy of with both hands saying these words:

Bishop Darius, receive the Cure of Souls which is both yours and mine; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Priest Amen.

The Bishop blesses the new Vicar:

Bishop Let us pray.
Almighty Father, give your servant, Darius, grace to fulfil his ministry in this parish with humility and self-sacrifice,

and the spirit of gentleness and peace. Give him faithfulness in proclaiming your word, and wisdom, strength and tenderness in caring for your people. As you have called him to your service, make him worthy of his calling, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

Darius may the God of Peace, who brought from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, give you vision, courage and love to do his will; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and all your work done in his name.

All **Amen.**

The Induction and Installation

The Bishop delivers the mandate of Induction to the Archdeacon saying:

Whereas we have duly and canonically admitted our well beloved in Christ, Darius, to the Cure of Souls in this parish, we hereby empower and require you to induct him into the real and actual possession of this Church and Benefice and to defend him so inducted.

Darius walks to the seat designated for him. The Archdeacon says:

Darius, I install you as the Vicar of this parish. The Lord will defend your going out and your coming in, from this time forth for evermore. Amen.

Darius is brought the keys of the church and the Archdeacon says:

By virtue of this mandate, I induct you into the real and actual possession of this church with all the rights and responsibilities belonging to it.

Darius is welcomed with applause. The Area Dean for Tower Hamlets along with selected invited guests, welcomes Darius and his family.
